Physical Therapist

CAREERHIGHLIGHT



What is a physical therapist?

A physical therapist, also known as a PT, helps individuals suffering from debilitating illnesses. They manage patients' pain, strengthen their muscles, and improve their functionality after the patient is referred from a physician. The therapist will first perform a physical exam, which assesses the current state of the patient, before restoring motion and muscle movement through exercise, stretching, and tools designed to expand the patient's physical capabilities. The average salary of a physical therapist is around \$80,000.

How can you become a physical therapist?

You must attend an accredited 4-year university and fulfill a Doctor of Physical Therapy program. Plan to major in a related healthcare field covering studies in topics like biology, anatomy, and physiology. DPT programs are typically 3 years, and must be accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education. After completing the NPTE, you are eligible to fulfill additional state requirements that you wish to practice in. You can also join residency programs after you graduate to specialize in fields such as orthopaedics and sports medicine.

Competitive Events:

JOB SEEKING SKILLS

Job Seeking Skills is a Leadership Event that provides HOSA members with the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills necessary for employment. Prior to competing at the conference, competitors prepare a one-page cover letter and one-page resume that both must be factual and accurate, including real work experience and education. At the conference, competitors complete a job application on-site and are given their interview time. Each candidate completes a five-minute interview with a judge at their allotted time. The goal



of this event is to inspire members to learn more about the application process for health-related positions. Competition in this event is a great opportunity to better improve your interviewing skills! If this sounds like you, check out the official HOSA guidelines by clicking on the arrow above.
