Physical Therapy is a different side of what most would consider the medical profession. Physical therapy affects the patient after a major incident, whether that be a surgery or a traumatic injury. PT's are extremely similar to their sister profession, an athletic trainer. While an athletic trainer focuses on injuries that come from a result of a sport, PT's improve the health of a patient regardless of the cause of the injury.

To become a physical therapist, a student must complete a bachelors degree and go back to school to obtain their doctorate in Physical Therapy.

COMPETITIVE EVENT SYNOPSIS

BIOMEDICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE

Do you have a passion for biomedical sciences or an interest in a biotechnology career? If so, the event Biomedical Laboratory Science would be perfect for you. Biomedical Lab Science is divided into **two rounds**. In round one, competitors take a test that consists of 50 multiple choice questions about a variety of biomedical science topics. The highest scoring individuals will advance to the next round, where competitors will be presented with a written scenario that calls for them to perform the skill portion of the event. The skill is chosen from a **list of seven**, and skills range from using a microscope to inoculating and streaking an agar plate. The scenario may call for more than one skill to be performed, and in each scenario there is a challenging component that requires critical thinking from the competitor. **Biomedical Lab Science is only offered at the State and National levels.**



HIV is a virus that attacks the body's immune system and can be spread by certain bodily fluids. The virus can spread through sexual contact, the sharing of used needles, and during pregnancy, birth, or breastfeeding. Once transmitted, the virus attacks the cells that fight against cancer and infections making the immune system weaker and weaker as one progresses through the stages of the disease. The first stage is an acute HIV infection where people experience flu-like symptoms. Then there is a second stage of clinical latency where HIV is still active but reproduces in very low amounts. Lastly, in stage three the disease progresses into AIDS where people will have such damaged immune systems and easily acquire opportunistic illnesses.

MONTHLY AWARENESS ARTICLE

Currently there are no known cures for HIV/AIDS, but HIV can be controlled with **antiretroviral therapy (ART)**. ART has helped people with HIV live longer, healthier lives while lowering their risk of transmission. It is always important to take safety precautions and avoid possible transmission of HIV. It is recommended that everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 should get tested at least once as a part of routine health care. 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
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
