What is an Anesthesiologist?

This month's career spotlight is dedicated to anesthesiologists. Anesthesiologists are primarily present in the operating room and are responsible for administering anesthesia and managing the pain of their patients.

Anesthesiologists must also be skilled with airways as they must manage the patient's respiration, while avoiding fatal complications such as a sudden laryngospasm. Anesthesiologist can also be found placing nerve blocks in which they are able to numb an entire part of the body.

How do you become an anesthesiologist?

Becoming an anesthesiologist is a lengthy process. This process consists of attending four years of undergraduate education, attending four years of med school, and finally completing 4 years of residency.

In Round One, competitors set up and show their display to judges. If selected, the competitors move to Round Two where they give a speech on the career they chose. This competitive event allows HOSA students to research and learn about careers they are interested in and share that interest with others.



DIABETES

Diabetes is a disease characterized by an abnormal amount of glucose in the blood. Glucose is the substance that provides fuel for your cells. There are

two types of diabetes: Type 1 and Type 2. Both are a result of inadequate production and usage of insulin. Insulin is a hormone that regulates the amount of sugar in the blood. Type 1 Diabetes involves insufficient insulin production, while Type 2 Diabetes suffer from insulin resistance. That means that their bodies produce insulin, but they are unable to use it effectively. Over 30 million people in the United States have diabetes, but only one in four know that they have the disease. It is the 7th leading cause of death and the number of those diagnosed has tripled in the last twenty years. It is important that individuals are aware of risk factors associated with diabetes. It is also crucial that people are aware of preventative measures that can be taken to keep the



disease from from developing. Physical activity and a healthy diet are key in the prevention of Type 2 Diabetes.
