


ev HOSA September SCHOOL IS BACK!

Competitive Event Synopsis

Are you interested in learning how to save a life? The CPR/First-Aid event might be right for you! This event provides you with knowledge and skills necessary to save a life <u>and</u> work in a healthcare setting.

This competitive event consists of 2 rounds and each team consists of 2 people. Round One is a written, multiple-choice test. The test will consist of 50 multiple choice questions, and competitors will have up to 60 minutes to complete it. Top scoring teams will advance to Round Two for the skills assessment. Round two will test skills such as adult and infant BLS/CPR with AED, severe bleeding and shock, choking, open fracture and splinting, severe burns, heat-related emergency, administering epinephrine pen, administering naloxone. This event is a great way to learn more about basic life saving measures, and also prepare for a future in healthcare!

We are extremely excited not only to grow our leadership skills to better serve NC HOSA members, but to also network with new and old friends. CAREER HIGHLIGHT: CARDIOLOGIST

This month's career highlight is a cardiologist. They are physicians who are experts in the care of the heart and blood vessels. They can address various cardiovascular issues and offer specialized care for specific conditions like heart rhythms, heart failure, or congenital problems. If you have heart or blood vessel issues requiring specialized attention, your primary care provider may recommend a cardiologist. Symptoms like chest pain, dizziness, or shortness of breath may warrant a visit to a cardiologist. Your cardiologist may provide ongoing care and monitoring for your conditions. In order to become a cardiologist one must get a bachelor's degree, complete the MCAT, enter medical school, pass the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE), complete a residency, enter a fellowship program, acquire licensure, and become certified. If interested in this career path, checkout these competitive events: CPR/First Aid, Life Support Skills, CERT (Community Emergency Response), and Emergency Medical Technician.
