Competitive Event Synopsis

It is a two-round competition that tests students' knowledge and skills in respiratory therapy. In the first round, students research a topic, interview a therapist, and present their findings to judges. In the second round, they perform a clinical skill, such as administering oxygen or measuring vital signs.






NATIONAL NUTRITION MONTH

These visuals are crucial for educational materials, medical textbooks, research publications, and patient care communication. They work closely with scientists, doctors, and other healthcare professionals to translate complex information into images that can be understood by students, surgeons, or even patients.

Their work isn't just about drawing pictures; it's about visual storytelling that educates and informs. Medical illustrators must be precise and accurate, as their illustrations can be used in surgical planning or to explain complex procedures to patients. They often use advanced software to create 3D models and animations, making the invisible world of the human body visible and more easily understood. It's a career that blends art, science, and technology in fascinating ways, and their contributions are vital to the medical and scientific communities.
