## Career Event Spotlight: Nursing/Nursing Assisting



This month we want to share some more information on the event "Nursing Assisting." This is a fantastic opportunity for HOSA members interested in careers in nursing or nursing assisting. Members will have the opportunity to strengthen their knowledge relating to anatomy, infection control, communication, providing care, reporting care, disabilities, disorders, and nursing assistant responsibilities. This event has two rounds. The first round is a written test consisting of 50 multiple choice questions. These questions will cover the topics previously mentioned. The second round will test the competitor's ability to perform one of the potential eight skills. Depending on the skill selected, a certain amount of time will be allotted to the competitor to perform the skill to the best of their ability. The potential skills and their respective judging sheets can be found under the guidelines for this event. Competitors' final score will be determined by the combination of their written test score and their skills section score.
